# 泽连斯基捅破这事儿,克宫矢口否认

当地时间13日,乌克兰总统泽连斯基主张称,朝鲜为支援正与乌克兰对战的 俄罗斯,不仅提供武器,还派遣了人力。对此,俄罗斯矢口否认称,该主张是 "假新闻"。

据路透社报道称,泽连斯基当晚在视频演讲中表示:"我们认为,俄罗斯同朝 鲜等政权间的同盟正得到强化","背后涉及的不仅是武器转移,朝鲜还实际 将朝鲜人送进占领军(俄罗斯)军队。"

他表示: "在这种情况下,我们与合作伙伴之间的关系很显然需要进一步加强", "最前线需要更多的支援。不是单纯的军事装备目录,而是关于向乌克 兰提供更远的远程力量和更持续的军需供给。"

Zelensky exposed this matter, the Kremlin flatly denied it

On the 13th, Ukrainian President Zelensky claimed that North Korea is not only providing weapons to Russia in its war against Ukraine, but also sending manpower. Russia has denied this claim, calling it "fake news."

According to Reuters, Zelensky said in a video address that evening: "We believe that the alliance between Russia and regimes like North Korea is being strengthened," and "This involves not only the transfer of weapons, but North Korea is actually sending North Koreans to the occupying army (Russia)."

He said: "In this situation, it is clear that our relationship with our partners needs to be further strengthened," and "The front line needs more support. Not just a simple list of military equipment, but about providing Ukraine with longer-range forces and more sustained military supplies."

### 朝鲜与俄罗斯关系无上限:平壤或派志愿军到乌克兰战场打仗

韩国和乌克兰官员本周表示,朝鲜士兵正在地面上支援俄罗斯军队,其中一些士兵可能已经死亡或受伤,这引发了人们对平壤和莫斯科之间的军事合作是否已进入新阶段的质疑。

华盛顿邮报报道称,韩国与乌克兰官员称朝鲜军队在乌克兰境内支持俄罗斯。金正恩已承诺"全力支持"俄罗斯总统普京对抗乌克兰。首尔和基辅表示,金正恩现在正通过派遣军事人员来表达自己的支持。

一名乌克兰军事情报官员匿名透露,"数千名"朝鲜步兵目前正在俄罗斯接受训练, 并可能在今年年底前被部署到乌克兰前线。该官员称,朝鲜军官已抵达俄罗斯占领 的乌克兰境内,观察俄罗斯军队并研究战场,但基辅尚未看到任何朝鲜部队参与战 斗。

Playing too big, North Korea may send volunteers

North Korea and Russia's relationship has no limits: Pyongyang may send volunteers to the Ukrainian battlefield.

South Korean and Ukrainian officials said this week that North Korean soldiers are supporting Russian forces on the ground, some of whom may have been killed or injured, raising questions about whether military cooperation between Pyongyang and Moscow has entered a new phase.

The Washington Post reported that South Korean and Ukrainian officials said North Korean troops are supporting Russia in Ukraine. Kim Jong-un has pledged "full support" for Russian President Putin in his fight against Ukraine. Seoul and Kyiv said Kim Jong-un is now expressing his support by sending military personnel.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov on Thursday dismissed reports that Pyongyang had sent military personnel to fight in Ukraine, calling them "fake news."

Last week, reports emerged on Telegram channels and Ukrainian media about North Korean soldiers supporting Russians in the Russian-occupied Donbas region.

Earlier this summer, North Korean leader Kim Jong-un and Russian President Vladimir Putin signed a joint defense treaty, with Kim pledging "full support" for Putin against Ukraine. The agreement highlighted how the leaders of the two countries, both subject to harsh Western sanctions, have deepened their partnership since Putin's invasion of Ukraine in early 2022.

Moscow first turned to Pyongyang for weapons support. The U.S. has said North Korea has shipped large quantities of ammunition, including artillery shells, to Russia. Both North Korea and Russia have denied these allegations.

Now, Pyongyang is apparently sending soldiers.

South Korean Defense Minister Lee Jong-sup told a parliamentary session on Tuesday [Oct.8] that reports of North Korean troops assisting Russia are "highly likely," adding that Pyongyang is looking to send more personnel to support Russia's war effort.

"Russia and North Korea have reached an agreement that is essentially a military alliance, so it is highly likely that North Korea will send more troops. We are assessing this," Lee told lawmakers.

Ukraine has alleged that Pyongyang has sent military personnel to oversee the use of North Korean ammunition and ballistic missiles, some of whom have been killed in action.

Andriy Kovalenko, head of the Center for Countering Disinformation under the National Security and Defense Council of Ukraine, posted on Telegram late Tuesday that Pyongyang has sent troops, including military engineers to oversee the use of weapons, "some of whom have already died."

Ukrainian military intelligence officials said it is unclear where the combat units trained in Russia will be deployed on the front lines in Ukraine. The official said Moscow could deploy them in border regions of Russia, freeing up Russian troops to fight in Ukraine.

Reports of North Koreans on the front lines began circulating after an anonymous Russian Telegram channel, "Kremlin snuffbox," reported that a Ukrainian missile strike on the Russian-occupied Donetsk region killed more than 20 soldiers, including six North Korean officers.

The Ukrainian military, citing sources in the Russian Ministry of Defense, said that three more North Koreans were injured. The North Koreans were there to "exchange experience" on the front lines. Ukrainian military officials confirmed that a Ukrainian missile strike on October 3 killed North Korean officers who "were not directly involved in combat, but were military personnel already integrated into the Russian army."

The Washington Post said that while North Korea rarely engages in foreign intervention, it has sent military personnel to assist in the use and development of weapons and related technologies. According to a UN panel of experts monitoring North Korea's sanctions violations, in 2016, North Korean missile technicians traveled to Damascus, reportedly staying at Syrian military facilities and helping to operate chemical and missile factories in Barzah, Adra, and Hama.

North Korea has also used military assistance, including weapons and training, to strengthen bilateral relations with other developing countries, such as Africa. According to Vietnamese records, during the Vietnam War, North Korea sent pilots to help defend North Vietnam from US air strikes.

## 普京终于等来东方盟友出兵

在俄乌冲突持续两年半仍未见分晓之际,俄罗斯似乎迎来了新的转机。正当美国深陷中东,尤其是以色列的纷争时,来自东方盟友的军事力量悄然进入了俄罗斯,准备助俄一臂之力对抗乌克兰。

据美媒 12 日的报道,美国情报确认,有数千名朝鲜士兵正在俄接受训练,预 计这些士兵将在年底前被派往乌克兰前线。

韩国方面的消息也指出,朝方准备向顿涅茨克和卢甘斯克派遣工兵和建筑工人, 帮助俄进行重建工作。

Putin finally waited for Eastern allies to send troops

As the conflict between Russia and Ukraine continues for two and a half years with no resolution in sight, Russia seems to be ushering in a new turning point. While the United States is deeply involved in disputes in the Middle East, especially Israel, military forces from its Eastern allies have quietly entered Russia, preparing to help Russia fight against Ukraine.

According to US media reports on the 12th, U.S. intelligence has confirmed that thousands of North Korean soldiers are undergoing training in Russia and it is expected that these soldiers will be sent to the front line in Ukraine before the end of the year.

South Korean news also pointed out that North Korea is preparing to send engineers and construction workers to Donetsk and Luhansk to help Russia with its reconstruction work.

Their weapons mainly rely on imitation, modification and independent research and development. Their military industry is mainly concentrated on army equipment, and there are obvious shortcomings in the air force and drones. The [Ukrainian] Defense Intelligence Agency claimed that North Korean engineers arrived in [eastern Ukraine] this summer. And by early October as well.

Ukrainian media even reported that the Ukrainian army discovered North Korean soldiers on the Donetsk front line and attacked them, causing more than 20 casualties, including 6 North Korean officers.

However, Russia denied the news that North Korea sent troops into Russia, saying it was completely a rumor. Putin also responded to relevant news in September, saying that Russia does not need any foreign troops to participate in Russian military operations.

Therefore, it is still unclear whether North Korea is actually sending troops.
